Burn care strategies for health care providers

Friday | 8 a.m. to 9:45 a.m.

Identify strategies to minimize burn scarring, manage pain and assist patients in their recovery. Emergency departments (EDs), urgent care facilities, inpatient units and wound centers see an array of burns in patients whose injuries are severe enough for a higher level of care yet do not meet burn center eligibility requirements.

Using the ABCESS approach to improve outcomes in the management of lower-extremity and foot wounds

Learn how practitioners can make outcome-based decisions that improve clinical wound management of the foot and ankle using the ABCESS wound management system. Developed at Temple University, this system expands on the TIME/DIME model for wound bed assessment.

Dermatological conditions that affect the lower leg

Friday | 1 to 2:45 p.m.

Understand various lower leg dermatological assessment and treatment modalities. Wound care conditions can range from localized issues to systemic conditions with skin manifestations. Differential diagnosis of leg wounds, recognition of inflammation-based conditions (e.g., pyoderma gangrenosum) and treatment of the periwound skin are essential to promote appropriate healing.

Topically speaking: The ABCs of topically applied products for biofilm-based wound management

Learn about the various biofilm-based treatment options available and their associated research. When evaluating and treating complex wounds (pressure ulcers, diabetic wounds, lower-extremity ulcers, nonhealing surgical wounds and chronic wounds), the use of appropriate topically applied products to manage biofilm, colonization and wound infection is essential.

Complex abdominal wounds and fistula nightmares: Tricks and tips

Identify various approaches to promote quality of life while targeting surgical repair when applicable. Managing complex abdominal wounds and enterocutaneous fistulas requires unique methods.
